## DOHA

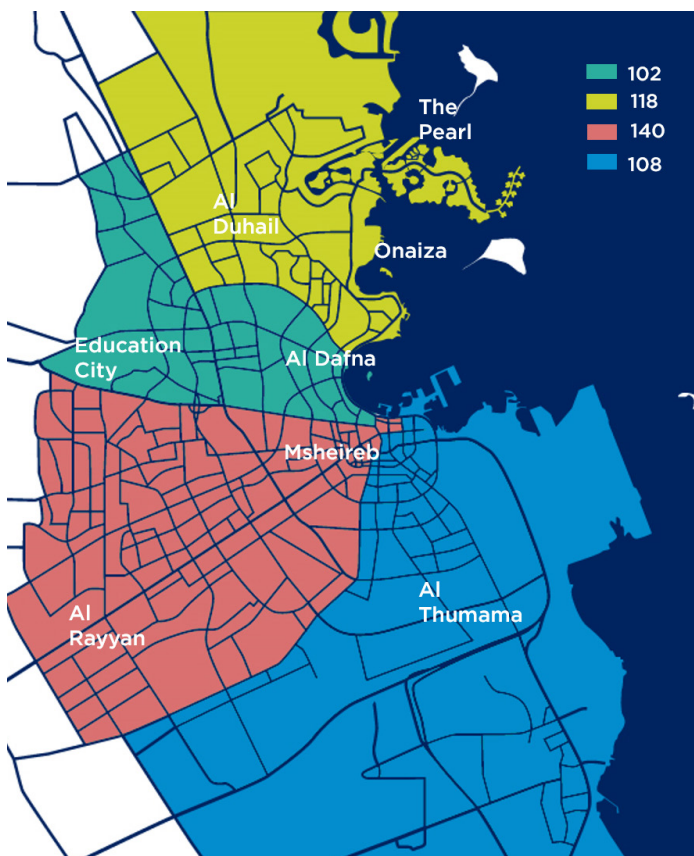


In its 6th edition, the 2018 RLB Crane Index® identified a total of 468 cranes across Doha, maintaining steady activity compared to 2017. The Civil sector saw a significant drop in crane numbers reflecting the progress of the Doha Metro project and the completion of infrastructure works around the capital.

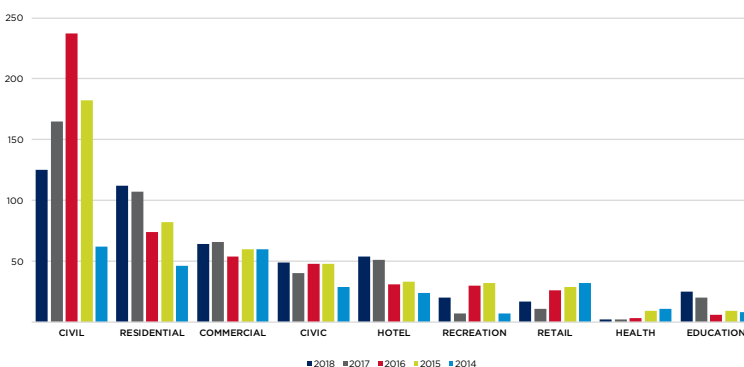
Recreation, Retail and Hotel sectors all saw an increase in crane numbers in preparation of the FIFA World Cup 2022. Civic and Education projects have also increased in number in response to the need of economic diversity and social infrastructure. With the general downsizing of organisations, the Commercial sector is starting to see a drop in crane count and the Residential sector is likely to see stability as the saturation of the current market is being reached.
